


Literacy








- To understand that number can be used for position- first, second, third etc when playing games.
- To show fast fingers up to 5.
- To begin to understand part/whole when subitising.



- To begin to be aware of seasonal changes. What can we notice when we are outside? What are the signs of Spring?
- To begin to understand and show an interest in different occupations through visitors coming in to talk to us and sharing factual books.
- To begin to understand what we would do in an emergency, who would we need to contact?

To begin to match rhyming objects and recognise when Miss Powis forgets her rhyming words when we sing our nursery rhyme!

Literacy Skills

- To begin to understand the differences between factual and fiction books.
- To understand that we can find out information from a factual book.
- To begin to see the different purposes for us to make marks to represent writing – making appointments, writing prescriptions etc in the role play area.
- To practise writing their name, forming the letters correctly (September intake). To recognise their name.

Expressive arts & design

- To use our observational skills to draw/paint Spring flowers. What is similar/different about them?
- To use our imagination to create emergency vehicles, props for certain jobs using box modelling and the large construction.
- To begin to explore clay.
- To begin to talk about the different textures when we are using a variety of materials for collage and box modelling.
- To go on a texture walk around school.
 Can we find something rough, smooth etc?

Communication and Language

- To begin to think of simple questions to ask our visiting parents about their job.
- To share our ideas about who helps us in different situations and how we think they might help us.
- To join in with our weekly nursery rhymes and wake and shake song.
- To learn new words related to the different occupations we are looking at.
