



BOOKFLIX


Every week we are going to share which books are "trending" across school.

This will allow you to discuss with your child what they have been reading for pleasure in class and also help us to promote the joy of reading too.


Trending in F1




Trending in F2

News from Year 1...




We've had a busy week in Year 1. Our maths this week was looking at counting forwards and backwards from any number to 10. In English we have shared the story of the Three Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig, making predictions as we went along and comparisons to the original tale. In Science we explored different materials and labelled things we found in the classroom. Our Geography was identifying and sorting human and physical features and in Art we have looked at the work of Vincent Van Gogh, in particular, his painting, 'Sunflowers'.





News from Year 2...



Year 2 have had a fabulous week! In English, we received a letter from Jim-Lad the fearless pirate from our book. We wrote back to him and told him about all of the incredible adventures we want to have like: dive with blue dolphins, walk the old wooden plank and fire the rusty canon.

In maths, we have used concrete resources to flexibly partition numbers. We have loved using the base 10 to support us!

Look out for some pirates that have escaped! In History we have created wanted posters to catch the most famous pirate from the past! In Science we have loved learning about things that are alive, were once alive and have never been alive.
