What an incredible first week back we have had! First we were extremely lucky to have the local Toy Museum come in and show us a range of toys from the past and tell us lots of interesting facts about them. We also got the chance to have a play and talk about the different materials they were made from. Then we had an amazing Sports Day and the



children did a super job, especially with cheering their fellow team mates on! We were very impressed with all their hard work and participation in each of the activities!

For the rest of the week we have been talking about people who help us. We have had great discussions about police officers, refuse collectors, doctors, nurses, teachers, librarians

and more. We also read the story 'The Day the Crayons Quit' and talked about how they help us create fantastic pictures. Then outside we have been enjoying the sun

and having fun creating our own shade by making dens with big pieces of material. The children have also been getting creative and developing their fine motor skills by making their very own split pin teddy bears. In maths we have been working hard on being secure in counting to 20 and beyond, recognising numerals 11 to 20 and using 10 frames and cubes to make these bigger numbers. We especially loved playing 11-20 bingo!!!

Next week we move on to our new topic 'What on Earth'.





What a great start to this half term! The children were very busy on Tuesday independently writing a description of a dinosaur. We are so impressed with their progress in their writing. In maths we have continued to look at position and direction, giving instructions of right, left, forwards, backwards, above and below has caused us lots of giggles. In English we have been using the suffixes 'ing', 'ed', 'er' and 'est' and the prefix 'un', we are getting better at these. Keep practising your 'Fancy Up Your Phonics' booklets, remember they are worth dojos. Congratulations to the Badgers for their triumphant win at Sports Day and well done to all of the children for their impeccable behaviour and determined spirit in competing. Next week will be the phonics screening check for all children in year 1.


